A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Boston was held in the Christopher J. Iannella Chamber, City Hall on Wednesday, April 2, 2025, at 12:07 P.M.

President Louijeune in the chair. All Councilors present.

Pastor Bruce Wall, Global Ministries Christian Church, delivered the invocation and the meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance.

The grant will fund a project to reconstruct and upgrade three corridors in the Roxbury neighborhood of Boston.
