AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND Reconnecting Communities - Pilot Program FUNDS, AWARDED BY United States Department of Transportation.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Transportation, is being petitioned for the issuance of funds to the Transportation Department; and

WHEREAS, the funds in the amount of ONE MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS **(\$1,800,000.00)** would fund the assessment of the feasibility of reconnecting the Chinatown neighborhood that was bisected by the construction of I-90. Therefore be it

ORDERED: that the Mayor, acting on behalf of the City of Boston be, and hereby is authorized, pursuant to section 53A of chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws, to accept and expend the United States Department of Transportation, Reconnecting Communities - Pilot Program award not to exceed the amount of ONE MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS **(\$1,800,000.00)**.
