RESOLUTION DECLARING MARCH 17, 2026 AS “BOSTON FLEET OLYMPIC MEDALIST DAY” IN THE CITY OF BOSTON

- WHEREAS,** Women’s ice hockey was first introduced to the winter Olympics in 1998 and since then, the US women’s team has medaled in every single competition, having won 2 golds, 4 silver and 1 bronze before this year’s Olympics in Milan; *and*
- WHEREAS,** The US women’s hockey team was unstoppable, winning 7 games and losing none, outscoring opponents 33 to 2. They faced Canada in the finals, the only other country to have won a gold medal in Women’s Hockey, and made a thrilling comeback to win in overtime, earning the team its 3rd gold medal; *and*
- WHEREAS,** The local team in the Professional Women’s Hockey League is the Boston Fleet, who sent 7 competitors, 4 of which won medals, including Megan Keller, Aerin Frankel and Haley Winn for USA and Alina Müller for Switzerland; *and*
- WHEREAS,** Megan Keller, Aerin Frankel, and Alina Müller began their distinguished collegiate careers at Boston institutions, with Keller attending Boston College and Frankel and Müller competing at Northeastern University; *and*
- WHEREAS,** The Boston Fleet are, as of February 25, leading the league in wins and well poised for success this season; *and*
- WHEREAS,** The Fleet’s first home game after their four medalists return from the Olympics is being hosted in Agannis Arena on March 17, 2026; ***NOW, THEREFORE BE IT***
- ORDERED:** The Boston City Council honors the Boston Fleet players in winning multiple Olympic medals, including 3 gold and 1 bronze and recognizes the tremendous impact that their victory represents to female athletes across Boston and the rest of the United States recognizing March 17, 2026 as “Boston Fleet Olympic Medalist Day” in the City of Boston.
