**RESOLUTION DECLARING APRIL 2, 2026 “CARDI B DAY” IN THE
CITY OF BOSTON**

- WHEREAS,** Cardi B is a globally recognized, Grammy Award-winning artist, entrepreneur, and cultural icon whose influence has extended beyond music to shape fashion, entertainment, and popular culture worldwide; *and*
- WHEREAS,** Boston is home to a strong and vibrant Dominican community whose presence is reflected in the City’s small businesses, cultural traditions, language, and everyday life; *and*
- WHEREAS,** Many residents in Boston, especially young people and members of the Afro-Latino community, see their own experiences, challenges, and aspirations reflected in Cardi B’s story and success; *and*
- WHEREAS,** Cardi B has used her platform to speak openly about her background, her journey, and the importance of staying connected to one’s culture, resonating with communities across Boston who value authenticity, resilience, and pride in identity; *and*
- WHEREAS,** Recognizing figures who reflect the lived experiences of Boston’s communities helps affirm a sense of belonging and acknowledges the cultural impact of those communities on the City itself; ***NOW THEREFORE BE IT***
- RESOLVED,** That the Boston City Council hereby declares April 2, 2026, to be “Cardi B Day” in the City of Boston, in recognition of her cultural impact and her connection to the values, identity, and lived experiences of many Boston residents.
