A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Boston was held in the Christopher A. Iannella Chamber, City Hall on Wednesday, January 8, 2025 at 12:06 PM.

President Louijeune in the Chair. Absent Councilor Breadon.

Pastor Don Nanstad, Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, delivered the invocation and the meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance.

The Chair moved to adopt the minutes from the December 11, 2024 meeting. Motion Prevailed; yeas 12, nays 1 (Flynn).
