REVEREND JESSE L. JACKSON, Sr.

In whose memory all members stood in tribute and reverence as the Council adjourned its meeting on February 25, 2026.

Reverend Jesse L. Jackson, Sr.'s leadership helped shape the modern Civil Rights Movement and expand justice, equity, and opportunity for generations of Americans of color. Mentored by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and founder of the Rainbow/PUSH Coalition, Reverend Jackson championed economic empowerment, voting rights, educational access, and nonviolent social change.

And be it further resolved, that the Boston City Council honors Reverend Jackson's advocacy and influence on the progress of civil rights in Boston, including efforts to desegregate Boston Public Schools in the 1970s, and recognizes that his work advancing school integration, economic justice, and voting rights brought attention to issues impacting Boston's communities of color, elevating local efforts toward racial equity, fair housing, and inclusive economic development and leaving a lasting legacy that continues to guide the City's pursuit of civil rights and social progress.
