A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Boston was held in the Christopher A. Iannella Chamber, Boston City Hall on February 16, 2022 at 12:02 P.M.

President Flynn in the Chair. All Councilors present.

Reverend Mary Eaton, Common Clergy, delivered the invocation and the meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
