WHEREAS, the United States Department Of Justice, is being petitioned for the issuance of funds to the Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the funds in the amount of ONE MILLION ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FOUR THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED SIXTY-SIX DOLLARS **(\$1,124,566.00)** would fund and support pre and post-arrest diversion of substance users to treatment in the area of Mass and Cass. Therefore be it
