A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Boston was held in the Christopher J. Iannella Chamber, City Hall on Wednesday, February 26, 2025 at 12:05 PM.

President Louijeune in the chair. All councilors present.

Father George Zubrowski, Our Lady of Czestochowa, delivered the invocation and the meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance.
