A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Boston was held in the Christopher A. Iannella Chamber, City Hall on Wednesday, May 8, 2024 at 12:07 P.M.

President Louijeune in the Chair. Absent Councilor Mejia.

Bishop William E. Dickerson, Greater Love Tabernacle, delivered the invocation and the meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

President Louijeune moved to adopt the minutes from the May 1, 2024 meeting. Motion Prevailed.
