

## **January 29, 2025**

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Boston was held in the Christopher A. Iannella Chamber, City Hall on Wednesday, January 29, 2025 at 12:07 PM.

President Louijeune in the Chair. Absent Councilor Breadon.

Pastor Audi Lynch, Faithful Church of Christ, delivered the invocation and the meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance.

The Chair moved to adopt the minutes from the January 15, 2025 meeting. Motion Prevailed.

Message and order authorizing the City of Boston to accept and expend the amount of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00), awarded by the Donor Group to be administered by the Parks & Recreation Department. The grant will fund the maintenance of the City of Boston Animal Shelter, and assistance with medical care for sick or injured animals (whose owners are Boston residents), through donations in an amount not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00).
