wanted to unify the six U.S. military branches under one central agency. Before this,

each military branch had its own day of celebration; and

WHEREAS: In May 1950, President Truman made it a holiday and celebrated the first Armed

Forces Day; and

WHEREAS: Today, a key part of Armed Forces Day is highlighting our military branches' roles in

national defense and security; and

WHEREAS: As we observe Armed Forces Day, we recognize the dedication, professionalism and

sacrifices of our military personnel, our veterans, and our military families. We thank our armed forces for their service and commitment to protecting our national security

and interests; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED:

That the Boston City Council proclaims May 18th, 2024 as Armed Forces Day, honors our U.S. military servicemen, veterans and military families, and recognizes the critical contributions and sacrifices they make to safeguard our country.
