A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Boston was held in the Christopher A. Iannella Chamber, City Hall on Wednesday March 29, 2023 at 12:12 P.M.

President Flynn in the Chair. All Councilors Present.

Father Michael DellaPenna, St. Leonard of Port Maurice, delivered the invocation and the meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
