**RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE WORK OF PUBLIC
WORKS EMPLOYEES DURING RECENT SNOW
STORM EMERGENCIES**

WHEREAS, The current season of winter has brought about an above average amount of snowfall, with Boston seeing a total of over 60 inches since the beginning of winter, with much of that snowfall coming from two snowstorms in late January and late February; *and*

WHEREAS, The two recent snowstorms greatly tested the City's ability to manage snowfall and proved to be a stern reminder to all Bostonians of the power of a New England winter; *and*

WHEREAS, Public Works employees worked day and night to clear and remove snow from streets and Code Enforcement officers worked to make sure all land owners were held accountable to their responsibility to clear sidewalks; *and*
