Appropriation and Tax Order for the fiscal year Commencing July 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2027

ORDERED:

I. That to meet the current expenses of the City of Boston, in the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2027, the respective sums of money specified in the schedules hereinafter set out, be, and the same hereby are, appropriated for expenditure under the direction of the respective boards and officers severally specified, for the several specific purposes hereinafter designated and, except for transfers lawfully made, for such purposes only said appropriations, to the extent they are for the maintenance and operation of parking meters, and the regulation of parking and other activities incident thereto (which is hereby determined to be \$46,000,000), being made out of the income from parking meters and, to the extent they are for other purposes, being made out of the proceeds from the sale of tax title possessions and receipts from tax title redemptions in addition to the total real and personal property taxes of prior years collected from July 1, 2024 up to and including March 31, 2025, as certified by the City Auditor under Section 23 of Chapter 59 of the General Laws, and out of available funds on hand, (which is hereby determined to be \$40,000,000) as certified by the Director of Accounts under said Section 23, and the balance of said appropriations to be raised by taxation pursuant to Section 23 of Chapter 59 of the General Laws:

That to meet so much of the expenses of maintaining, improving and embellishing in the fiscal period commencing July 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2027, cemeteries owned by the City of Boston, or in its charge, as is not met by the income of deposits for perpetual care on hand December 31, 2025, the respective sum of money specified in the subjoined schedule be, and the same hereby is, appropriated out of the fund set up under Chapter 13 of the Acts of 1961 the same to be expended under the direction of the Commissioner of Parks and Recreation:

This appendix is a supplement to the amended tax order; to reflect the Council's specifications and legislative intent regarding changes to funding. The Council's proposed amendments are as follows:

Inter-Departmental Amendments:

Inter-departmental amendments involve the movement of funds from one department to another. They are reflected in shifts on the tax order. Inter-departmental amendments total \$10,365,000 of the amendments.

Access to Counsel

Continuing the Access to Counsel program which provides full legal representation for families with children in school at risk of eviction through a partnership with Greater Boston Legal Services.

Age Strong - Behavioral Access Grant

Recommendations:

Recommendation amendments involve the movement of funds within a category within a department. They are not reflected in shifts on the tax order. Intra-departmental amendments are recommendations that as part of the budget process, have been previously agreed to by their relevant departments through iterative conversations between the committee and department heads.

Inter-departmental amendments, intra-departmental amendments, and recommendation amendments total \$11,520,000 of the appropriation order, or 0.57%.
