I hereby transmit for your approval an Order authorizing the City of Boston to accept and expend the amount of ONE MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SIX THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS (**\$1,736,520.00**) in the form of a grant, State FY25 Council on Aging formula allocation, awarded by MA Executive Office of Elder Affairs to be administered by the Age Strong Commission.

The grant would fund social and health care services for 115,768 older adults in the City of Boston at \$15 per person, according to 2020 Census data from UMass Boston Donahue Institute.

AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND State FY25 Council on Aging formula allocation FUNDS, AWARDED BY MA Executive Office of Elder Affairs.

WHEREAS, the MA Executive Office of Elder Affairs, is being petitioned for the issuance of funds to the Age Strong Commission; and

WHEREAS, the funds in the amount of ONE MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SIX THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS (**\$1,736,520.00**) would fund social and health care services for 115,768 older adults in the City of Boston at \$15 per person, according to 2020 Census data from UMass Boston Donahue Institute. Therefore be it

ORDERED: that the Mayor, acting on behalf of the City of Boston be, and hereby is authorized, pursuant to section 53A of chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws, to accept and expend the MA Executive Office of Elder Affairs, State FY25 Council on Aging formula allocation award not to exceed the amount of ONE MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SIX THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS (**\$1,736,520.00**).
