AS "FENWAY COMMUNITY CENTER DAY"
IN THE CITY OF BOSTON IN HONOR OF 10 YEARS
OF SERVICE TO THE FENWAY COMMUNITY

- WHEREAS,** The Fenway Community Center (FCC) was founded in response to the need for a dedicated, inclusive community space within the Fenway neighborhood; *and*
- WHEREAS,** Through the vision of community leaders and the strength of public-private partnerships, the FCC officially opened its doors in 2016 with a mission to enrich the lives of all Fenway residents; *and*
- WHEREAS,** Since its founding, the FCC has served as an essential gathering place, fostering connection and providing vital programming that supports the diverse needs of the Fenway community; *and*
- WHEREAS,** The impact of the FCC is evident: in the last year alone, FCC hosted 614 programs, welcomed over 15,500 visitors, and remained open for more than 2,380 hours; *and*
- WHEREAS,** This 2026 annual "Love the Fenway" fundraiser, honorarily co-hosted by Mayor Michelle Wu, brings together current and former public officials, as well as dedicated private partners, to celebrate a decade of the Fenway Community Center and ensure its continued ability to provide connection, care, and continuity for the neighborhood; *and*
- WHEREAS,** The success of the Fenway Community Center would not be possible without the dedication of its board members, partners, sponsors, staff, and volunteers; **NOW, THEREFORE BE IT**
