TO THE CITY COUNCIL

Dear Councilors:

I transmit herewith for your approval an Order that will authorize the Department of Innovation and Technology (DoIT) to enter into up to two long-term contracts with terms of up to five years, for payment processing services that secure constituent personal and financial information; increase accessibility with expanded language and business functions; and integrates with the City's other financial systems. Massachusetts General Law 30B § 12(b) limits the length of contracts to a three-year period unless permission is granted by the local City Council.

DoIT is in the process of re-soliciting contracts for payment processing services and believes it is in the best interest of the City for a longer contract period to prevent any operational interruptions, standardize the multiple systems integrations, and modernize the experience for constituents and public servants alike.

I urge this Honorable body to adopt this Order so the City can procure long-term payment processing contracts to ensure the continued information technology support for citywide services remains uninterrupted.
