A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Boston was held in the Christopher A. Iannella Chamber, City Hall on Wednesday, February 28, 2024 at 12:09 P.M.

President Louijeune in the Chair. All Councilors Present.

Juan Aurelio Lopez, City Council Central Staff – Director of Research and Policy, delivered the invocation and the meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
