A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Boston was held in the Christopher A. Iannella Chamber, Boston City Hall on March 16, 2022 at 12:15 P.M.

President Flynn in the Chair. Councilor Baker Absent.

Father John Currie, St. Peter's Holy Family and St. Patrick's Parishes, delivered the invocation and the meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

President Flynn moved to adopt the minutes from the March 9, 2022 meeting.

Message and order authorizing the City of Boston to accept and expend the amount of Five Hundred Fifty Five Thousand One Hundred Sixty Six Dollars and Forty Cents (\$555,166.40) in the form of a grant, for the Federal FY20 Assistance to Firefighters Grant, awarded by the Federal Emergency Management Agency to be administered by the Fire Department. The grant will fund safety training and fitness equipment to support officer health and wellness.

The grant will fund the launch of an e-cargo bike delivery pilot, which will include supporting local businesses to join the program.
