A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Boston was held in the Christopher A. Iannella Chamber, Boston City Hall on Wednesday, September 21, 2022 at 12:24 P.M.

Senior Member Councilor Breadon in the Chair. Absent President Flynn.

The meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Councilor Breadon moved to adopt the minutes from the September 14, 2022 meeting. Motion prevailed.

1134 Message and order authorizing the City of Boston to accept and expend the amount of One Million Nine Hundred Sixty Nine Thousand Sixty Six Dollars (\$1,969,066.00) in the form of a grant, for the Federal FY23 Title III-C Nutrition Services Program, awarded by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, passed through the MA Executive Office of Elder Affairs, to be administered by the Age Strong Commission. The grant will fund nutrition services for older adults in the City of Boston. These services are enhanced by Federal Nutrition Services Incentive Program and the State Elder Lunch Program grants.
